The US Reports More Than 2.4 Million Encounters With Migrants In The Last Year

The United States Customs and Border Protection (CBP) reported on Saturday that fiscal year 2023 ended for US border authorities with the highest number of encounters with migrants on record. In the last twelve months, migrants were intercepted at the US southwest border more than 2.4 million times.

In the month of September, when the fiscal year ends, border authorities detailed that they intercepted migrants some 269,735 times, making it also the month with the highest number of encounters in recent years.

This number includes people who showed up at ports of entry with a CBP One appointment to interview with a border agent. The number of people who tried to enter irregularly, without presenting themselves to the authorities, was 218,763.

Venezuelans are one of the nationalities with the highest number of incidents. In September alone, some 66,584 migrants of this nationality attempted to cross irregularly into the United States, according to data from the authorities.



Frequently Asked Questions

Can I Fix Papers If I Was Deported?

Whether it is possible to fix your papers in the United States after being deported requires a process and depends on several factors. Generally, deportation from the United States carries a ban on re-entry that can vary, depending on the circumstances of your deportation. To find a solution to your situation, you should consider the following:

You must wait until the re-entry ban period has passed before attempting to legally return to the United States.

In some cases, it is possible to request a waiver of the re-entry ban. This requires showing that you have a valid reason to return to the United States, such as a close family relationship with U.S. citizens or permanent residents, and that your absence causes extreme hardship to those family members.

If you have family members who are American citizens or permanent residents, they could sponsor you to obtain an immigrant visa. Additionally, you can opt for work, investment or asylum visas, if your case qualifies.

It is highly recommended that you seek the advice of an immigration attorney with experience in deportation and reentry cases, such as Serving Immigrants. An attorney will help you evaluate your options and follow proper legal procedures.
